This strategy aims to support our current, state and local jurisdictional-based Planning, Exercise and Training (PET) Program involving 8 Regional PET areas. PET Regions have identified three primary areas of investment: planning activities, training, and exercises.

Planning activities for FY11 will include planning, training and development activities regarding policy and procedures that support the state standards for identification protocols, with the potential for using the FIPS (Homeland Security Presidential Directive) to meet the code standards. The goal includes establishing conformity within all PET regions in order to provide the necessary identification systems requiring user training and exercising in order to identify gaps within the system. Policies and procedures for the identification process will include use of the identification cards for Incident Check In and Check Out, to create a documentation system to account for all on-scene personnel. Planning activities will continue to assess and prioritize regional needs.

Planning and training activities will include: Proper operation of Search and Rescue equipment for both land and water to ensure the capability and accurate operation of the equipment and to provide special rescue assistance to state and local authorities when requested by regional stakeholders in recovery operations; and training for communications and control center facility security. Equipment includes but is not limited to: sonar, light trailers, and related gear for performing search and rescue operations during the day and night.

Planning, Exercise and Training Regions will continue to foster collaborations among stakeholders including Citizen Corps, Association of Threat Assessment Professionals, and other regional entities for emergency public information and warning, as well as collaboration with non emergency agencies to improve standing of preparedness, provide public education; and accomplish specific types of planning to include but not be limited to continuity of government/operations, increased awareness of NIMS and NRP, evacuation, mass fatality, agricultural response, terrorism response, special needs populations, communications, emergency operations centers, public information/education, debris management, and volunteer management.

Training and exercises will be conducted to foster increased expertise in incident management concepts and activities (Obj. C5, p.11), implementation of interoperability equipment (Obj. D5, p. 14), outreach activities to elevate awareness and preparation among community stakeholders, and specific scenario training (Obj. B4-5, p. 9-10). All exercises will be HSEEP compliant (Obj. B5, p. 10). Funding may also be used to support Regional Planning, Exercise and Training Officers.
