Set agenda, date, time and location for next meeting

Nebraska has the responsibility to develop, deploy and sustain interoperable communications tools and techniques to effectively deliver public services. Interoperability is envisioned as a “no walls” approach allowing public safety organizations to intercommunicate on demand without hindrance. Nebraska recognizes that response is broad and that it is best served with investment in both human and technology capital.

Interoperability: The ability of Public Safety responders to share information via voice and data communications systems on demand, in real time, when needed, and as authorized.
