2. Appointment of NCOR RFP evaluation team

Motion to accept the proposed members of the Technical Review Team and the Cost Evaluation Team made by Jim Gerweck; Tom Schwarten seconded the motion and it was passed by affirmative votes via roll call vote of all the members present.

- 4. Mutual Aid base station project Pete Peterson

The Mutual Aid Base Station equipment must be in place to support the new technology. There has been discussion of starting a competitive bidding process to see if the price would be lower than the state contract. VHF would go to every tower, and UHF and 800 would go some locations. The NEMA staff members (Rod and Steve) can bring NCOR the specifications of mutual base stations for committee approval. NEMA will need to build the cost of these staff members in the 2010 allocation of the Homeland Security Grants if they are to continue working on behalf of the PET Regions on mutual aid issues. NEMA would also require purchase of software to design coverage maps. The Mutual Aid Plan also needs to be revised to include an up to date frequency plan.

- 5. MOU Templates Denise Bulling and Darrin Lewis No update at this time.
- 6. SOP Development Tom Schwarten

The Operational Work Group has put together the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for NWIN and NCOR. The Administrative Work Group will be meeting soon to review the SOPs. The SOPs will still need NCOR input, especially with Mutual Aid procedures, which will become a priority for NCOR. NCOR Committee Members are to review the SOPs and send suggested changes the Joint Operational Work Group, which includes Mark Conrey and Pat Foust and Pat Gerdes and Darrin Lewis from NCOR.

7. Grant and Project timelines

The 2006 Homeland Security Grant ends on Dec. 31, 2009. The 2007 Homeland Security Grant is probably ending March 2010. The PSIC Grant may be extended but NEMA is currently planning on September 30, 2010 as the end date.

8. MOU of 2006 Homeland Security Grant Funds in support of NEMA staff working with PET Regions
It was suggested that NCOR, serving as the local government representatives, allocate funding from the
2006 homeland security grant funds that must be expended by December 31, 2009 to NEMA in support
of the work performed by Steve Cass and Rod Hutt on behalf of the Regions in preparation for the RFP
for mutual aid network development.

Motion to accept the MOU as written from NEMA made by Tim Hofbauer; Jim Gerweck seconds the motion. The motion passes with 7 affirmative votes, and 2 abstaining votes, and 1 absentee.

# Information/Reports

1. NEMA -Dan Hiller

NEMA is in process of working out issues related to the roll out of the software package Net Planner for local use. NEMA plans to introduce Net Planner to counties as they become due for an update of their local emergency operations plan.

# **Discussion Items**

1. Overview of 2009 Homeland Security Grants – Dan Hiller

A spreadsheet was distributed with grant allocations for 2009 across investment justifications. In the 2008-2009 funds, it was assumed that the 25% set aside for law enforcement activities (IED funds) would be enough to cover the costs for the Bomb Squads. Each of the nine investment priorities was discussed. Tom Jensen and Dr. Mogan put a handout together for Investment #5, Agriculture response to help PET Regions coordinate with the Department of Agriculture (DOA) to meet the justifications.

2. Annual Report to Governor Heineman – Pete Peterson

Per the NCOR Executive Order, there is a requirement for NCOR to prepare an Annual Report to the Governor. NCOR decided to do the annual report by the calendar year. NEMA plans is to use the Homeland Security template as a general template for state level reports. Denise Bulling and Al Berndt will work to make the template available at the next meeting.
