

SCPETR Meeting
July 2, 2014

Brian called the meeting to order at 1330hrs. The open meetings law was posted

Kirt motioned to approve the agenda, Becker seconded, motion carried

Kirt motioned, Becker seconded to approve the previous minutes, motion carried.

Mark Meints w/ the NDOR spoke regarding a new training program. The National Traffic Incident Management Training (TIM) is a free, 4 hour training put on by the Dept. of roads. It will provide 3 Continuing ed hours. You could get \$600 worth of equipment per agency by taking the class. Jill will set something up w/ Mark for training at the September 3rd meeting.

Updates of scheduled trainings:

Regarding trainings: It will be a continual SCPETR policy that any person attending a PET training will need to have supervisory approval. Priority will be given to those that meet the prerequisites for the training.

The LE training (Internet Investigations) will be December 9th and 10th. The course will be held in Kearney.

Kate coordinated the THIRA meeting this morning. She stated the disaster behavioral health exercise will be held July 24th in Omaha. They will be doing an exercise for the education. On the 25th, they will be hosting the National Behavioral Health Conference. This year, it will be focused on those who have experienced disasters. August 7th and 8th in Broken Bow will have a School Safety Conference. There will be Law enforcement CEU's. This is hosted by the East Central PET regional. The training is free.

NPSCC update: Nothing for NRIN, the next meeting for that is at the end of July.

By-law amendments: tabled until September.

New Business:

2014 work plan:

Kent advised they are seeing a new number of liquid flammables coming through railroads. Amtrak is also becoming more active. These are putting pressure on the locals and we need to look at some more planning/training.

The ethanol plants are also increasing production and most fire departments are not trained. Kent is requesting some more training for Fire.

Chip motioned to write the following:

- Credentialing: \$30,000 for rapid tag in North Platte and Kearney, extra sustainment for Kirt and Loren
- IMT training: Incident Commander and Operations Chief, 300/400 course, CBRNE/Railroad training \$20,000
- Marketing Campaign: Phone app etc. \$15,680
- NRIN equipment \$70,000

= \$135,680

Darrin seconded. Motion Carried

LE funding \$76,724. A discussion was held regarding the LEG group funding requests. The LEG group felt that the state requirements should not be mandated.

Kirt made a motion to submit what the LEG group suggests for equipment and usage of the LE funds. Chip seconded. Motion carried.

South Central All-Hazard Support Group: Loren provided a policy for review. Loren is recommending a type 4 team, rather than a type 3 team. This is not just an Emergency Management Team. He is requesting medical, law enforcement, Fire, city and county officials, etc. to be involved. He would like to see a 'traveling' team in an effort to be prepared for a disaster. Please forward any names to Loren. He will try and get a final draft copy by the end of next week.

Good of the Group: Kirt advised the LEADRS conference is the 8th and 9th. He will be deploying the rapid tag system and Mobile express. If you are interested in helping, please contact Kirt.

Jill advised that with the exception of Clay County, all of the dues for 2013-2014 have been paid.

Kirt motioned to adjourn at 3:45, Becker seconded. Motion carried.
